

COMPANY SECURITY OFFICER (CSO)

COURSE AIM

To provide knowledge to Company Security Officer (CSO), in particular the duties and responsibilities with respect to the security of a ship, for ensuring the development (or for developing) of a ship security assessment, for ensuring the development (or for developing) of implementation, maintenance and updating of a ship security plan, and for liaising with Ship Security Officers (SSOs) and with Port Facility Security Officers (PFSOs).

TARGET GROUP

The persons employed (or to be employed) by a company and that they are likely to be designated as Company Security Officer.

COURSE CONTENT

The course will include the following subject

- Introduction, Historical perspective, Current security threats and patterns,
- Maritime Security Policy,
- Security Responsibilities,
- Ship Security Assessment and On-scene inspections,
- Security Equipment,
- Ship Security Plan,
- Threat Identification,
- Ship Security Actions,
- Emergency Preparedness, Drills and exercises,
- Security Administration,
- Security Training

This course is designed around the IMO model course 3.20.

COMPETENCY

Delegates will be required to pass a theoretical assessment of skills, a written or verbal examination of theory

PRE REQUISITE

The persons employed (or to be employed) by a company and that they are likely to be designated as Company Security Officer. However, no specific entry requirements are envisaged

METHOD OF TRAINING

This course includes theoretical and demonstration components and will include the visual teaching aids, writing materials and provision of catering.

COURSE DURATION

Two (2) days.
