

COMPETENCE FOR SEAFARERS WITH DESIGNATED SECURITY DUTIES

COURSE AIM

The course provides participants with the knowledge required to enable personnel without designated security duties in connection with a Ship Security Plan (SSP) to enhance ship security in accordance with the requirements of Chapter XI-2 of SOLAS 74 as amended, the ISPS Code, and section A-VI/6-2 of the STCW Code, as amended.

TARGET GROUP

This course is aimed at seagoing personnel in any capacity as part of the mandatory STCW requirements. Seafarers or other shipboard personnel, such as armed guards, likely to have designated security duties in connection with the Ship Security Plan, shore-based personnel involved in ship security. This course is delivered in accordance with section A-VI/6-2 of the STCW Code.

COURSE CONTENT

A candidate successfully completing the SSO Program will be able to:

- Maintain the conditions set out in a Ship Security Plan
- Recognition of security risks and threats
- Undertake regular security inspections of the ship
- Proper usage of security equipment and systems

This course is designed around the IMO model course 3.26.

COMPETENCY

Achievement of competence is assessed continuously during the course and by means of a final test.

PRE REQUISITE

All delegates must be in possession of a valid seafarer medical certificate issued by an approved medical practitioner who won't be assigned specific security duties in connection with the ship security plan.

METHOD OF TRAINING

Interactive training methods are used to ensure communication of the required knowledge, understanding and proficiency and will include the visual teaching aids, writing materials and provision of catering.

COURSE DURATION

One (1) day.
